Coach Ullery is looking forward to a more successful season next year despite graduation losses.

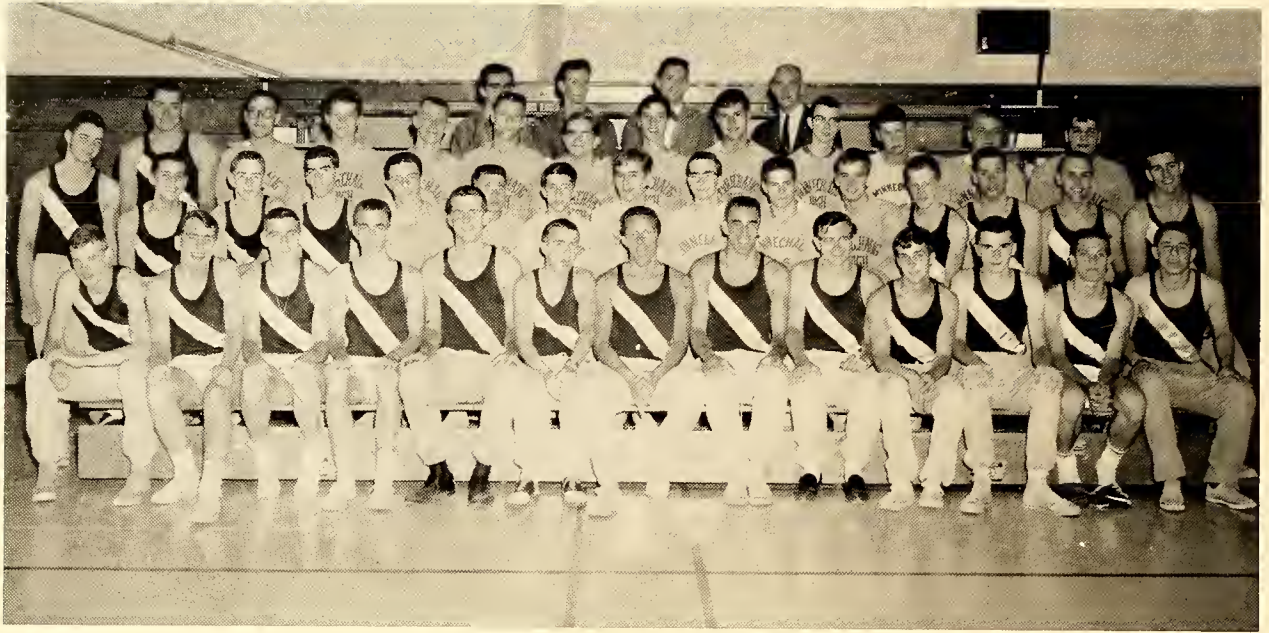

Coach Ehnstrom is optimistic about the coming seasons because of the enthusiasm shown the sport by the underclassmen.



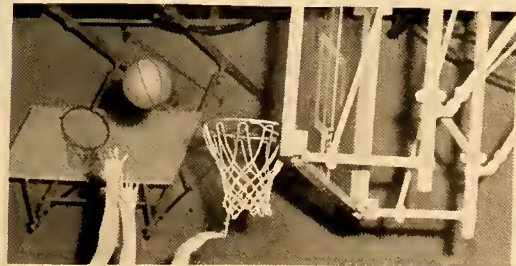
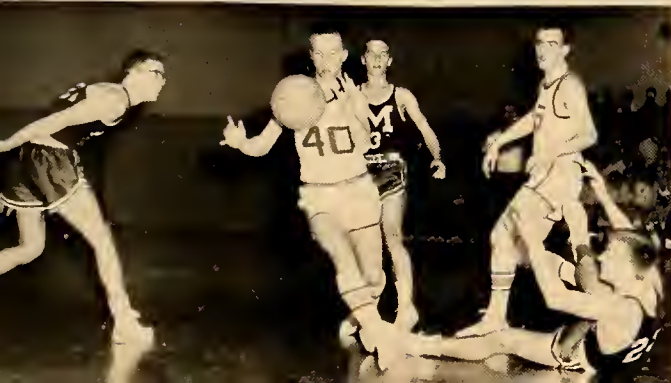
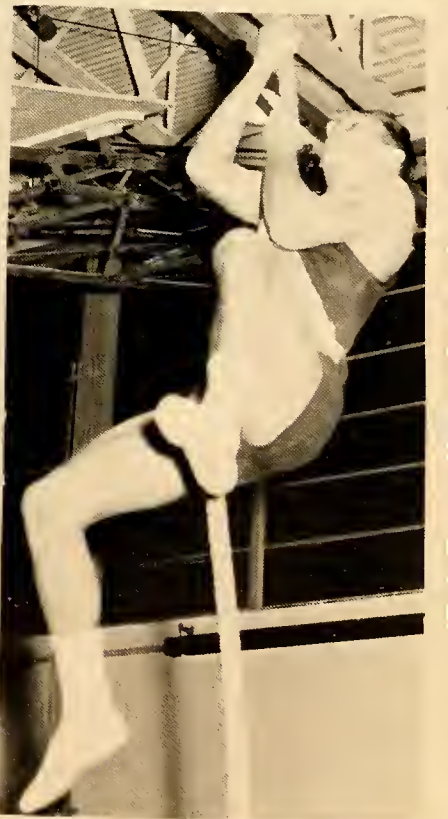
